God.

Respecting our parents, friends, family, our fellow people is an important part of being a good Catholic.

Helping those in need and less fortunate are part of being a good Catholic.

Spreading love to others even those we don't always agree with, have angered you or upset you are important in a good Catholic.

To forgive those that have done you wrong as hard as it could be is another important part of being a Catholic.
